The Council of the RAY Society, feeling that the objects it has in view are not sufficiently known, beg to call attention to the circumstances which gave rise to its existence. For many years previous to 1844, Naturalists had felt the necessity of combining for the distinct purpose of bringing out some of the more important Works on Natural History, which existing Societies could not publish, and which would not be undertaken by any publisher. It was also felt very desirable to reproduce some of the older Standard Works of British Naturalists, and, by translation, to introduce to the British public the more important Works on Natural History published on the Continent, more especially in Germany. For the accomplishment of these objects, the Society commenced its labours in 1844, and have guice published the following Works:

THE LAWS OF THE RAY SOCIETY

I. That this Society shall be called "THE RAY SOCIETY;" and that its object shall be the promotion of Natural History, by the printing of original works in Zoology and Botany, of new editions of Works of established merit, of rare tracts and MSS., and of translations and reprints of Foreign Works, which are generally inaccessible from the language in which they are written, or from the manner in which they have been published.

N.B.—It will be a direction to the Council that they shall not print anything that appears to them subble to transactions of established societies, nor any Work which a respectable publisher shall undertake to publish without charge to the author.

II. Every subscriber of one guinea annually to be considered a Member of the Society, and to be entitled to one copy of every book published by the Society during the year to which his subscription relates; and no Member shall incur any liability beyond the annual subscription.

III. That the annual subscriptions shall be paid in advance, and considered to be due on the 1st day of January in each year; and that such Members as do not signify their intention to withdraw from the Society before the 2d day of June, shall be considered to continue Members, and be liable to the year's subscription.

IV. The Management of the Society shall be vested in a Council of Twenty-one Members, of whom one third shall have their stated residences in London, and all of whom shall be eligible for re-election at the annual meeting.

V. That the Council hereafter shall be elected by the Members, at a meeting to be held at the time and place of the meeting of the British Association for the Advancement of Science, and that no Member whose subscription is in arrear be allowed to vote at any meetings.

VI. That the Council shall elect a Secretary and a Treasurer, who shall ex officio be Members of the Council.

VII. The annual subscription shall be deposited in a chartered bank, in the name of the Treasurer and two Members of the Council.

VIII. The accounts of the receipt and expenditure of the Society shall be examined annually by two Auditors appointed by the Council; the Auditors to be Members of the Society, who are not Members of Council, and their statement circulated among the subscribers.

IX. That the number of copies of the Society's publications shall, unless otherwise directed by the Council, be limited to the number of actual Subscribers who shall have been enrolled and paid their subscriptions on or before the 2d day of June.

X. That the Editors of Works published by the Society be entitled to a number of copies. not exceeding twenty, as may be decided by the Council.

THE Council of the RAY SOCIETY, feeling that the objects it has in view are not sufficiently known, beg to call attention to the circumstances which gave rise to its existence. For many years previous to 1844, Naturalists had felt the necessity of combining for the distinct purpose of bringing out some of the more important Works on Natural History, which existing Societies could not publish, and which would not be undertaken by any publisher. It was also felt very desirable to reproduce some of the older Standard Works of British Naturalists, and, by translation, to introduce to the British public the more important Works on Natural History published on the Continent, more especially in Germany. For the accomplishment of these objects, the Society commenced its labours in 1844, and have since published the following Works:

THE LAWS OF THE RAY SOCIETY.

I. That this Society shall be called "THE RAY SOCIETY;" and that its object shall be the promotion of Natural History, by the printing of original works in Zoology and Botany, of new editions of Works of established merit, of rare tracts and MSS., and of translations and reprints of Foreign Works, which are generally inaccessible from the language in which they are written, or from the manner in which they have been published.

N.B.—It will be a direction to the Council that they shall not print anything that appears to them suitable to transactions of established societies, nor any Work which a respectable publisher shall undertake to publish without charge to the author.

II. Every subscriber of one guinea annually to be considered a Member of the Society, and to be entitled to one copy of every book published by the Society during the year to which his subscription relates; and no Member shall incur any liability beyond the annual subscription.

III. That the annual subscriptions shall be paid in advance, and considered to be due on the 1st day of January in each year; and that such Members as do not signify their intention to withdraw from the Society before the 2d day of June, shall be considered to continue Members, and be liable to the year's subscription.

IV. The Management of the Society shall be vested in a Council of Twenty-one Members, of whom one third shall have their stated residences in London, and all of whom shall be eligible for re-election at the annual meeting.

V. That the Council hereafter shall be elected by the Members, at a meeting to be held at the time and place of the meeting of the British Association for the Advancement of Science, and that no Member whose subscription is in arrear be allowed to vote at any meetings.

VI. That the Council shall elect a Secretary and a Treasurer, who shall ex officio be Members of the Council.

VII. The annual subscription shall be deposited in a chartered bank, in the name of the Treasurer and two Members of the Council.

VIII. The accounts of the receipt and expenditure of the Society shall be examined annually by two Auditors appointed by the Council; the Auditors to be Members of the Society, who are not Members of Council, and their statement circulated among the subscribers.

IX. That the number of copies of the Society's publications shall, unless otherwise directed by the Council, be limited to the number of actual Subscribers who shall have been enrolled and paid their subscriptions on or before the 2d day of June.

X. That the Editors of Works published by the Society be entitled to a number of copies, not exceeding twenty, as may be decided by the Council.

REPORT

OF THE

COUNCIL OF THE RAY SOCIETY

READ AT THE

ANNUAL MEETING OF THE RAY SOCIETY, AT BIRMINGHAM, ON FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 8th, 1865.

J. GWYN JEFFREYS, Esq., F.R.S., IN THE CHAIR.

THE Council are happy, in presenting their Twenty-second Annual Report, to announce a considerable increase in the number

of the Members of the Ray Society.

The appeal made by the Council in their Report last year, "that all interested in the prosperity of the Society should do their best to enlist new Members," has been so well received that between our Annual General Meeting at Bath last September and the close of the year nearly fifty new Members joined our ranks. Since the commencement of the year 1865 other new Members have joined us, so that the total addition to the Society has been nearly three times as great as the usual addition to our ranks in a year. On the other hand, our losses by deaths and withdrawals have been fewer than usual, though among the former the Council has to regret the death of a colleague whom they could ill afford to spare. The loss of such a man as Dr. Hugh Falconer has been deeply felt in all scientific circles.

The following figures will at a glance show the improving position of the Society: thus—

The number of Members who paid for the year 1862 was 508.

"" " 1863 , 530.
"" " 1864 , 549.

Our list for 1865 is not yet complete, but ought to show a considerable increase on the latter figure.

Glancing at our expenditure, we find that in the five years ending June, 1860, we paid away £2214 6s. 1d.; in the five years that have since clapsed we have expended £4506 2s. 7d.—more than double the former amount.

The first volume for the year 1865 is now in the hands of our Members.

The 'British Hemiptera Heteroptera,' by J. W. Douglas and John Scott, forms a somewhat bulky octave of 627 pages, illustrated with twenty-one plates, most carefully engraved by E. W. Robinson. This volume is the most important addition to Entomological Literature which has been furnished by this country for very many years, and the value of the work is all the greater that it treats of an order of insects which has hitherto been so much neglected. To break new ground in science is often a thankless and dreary task, the circle capable of appreciating such labours being frequently small indeed. In the present instance the duality of authorship has no doubt much facilitated the execution of a labour from which most of us singly would have shrunk.

The second volume for the year 1865 will be the concluding volume of Dr. Bowerbank's 'Monograph of the British Spongiadae.' But for Dr. Bowerbank's unfortunate illness this volume would have been ready ere now; the manuscript is in an extremely forward state, and, Dr. Bowerbank's health being now restored, the Council are sanguine that they may yet be able to issue the volume before the

close of the year.

The fact that two volumes would be issued for the year 1865 to the Members of the Ray Society was very fully advertised early in the year, and many lovers of science responded to these advertisements by joining the Society, and at once contributing to its funds. The Council feel that it would be unjust to their old Members and to those who joined early in the season to place those who may now join during the remainder of this year on the same footing, and have therefore decided that all those joining the Society after the 13th of September (the day on which the meeting of the British Association closes at Birmingham) shall only receive, in return for their Guines Subscription, the second volume for 1865 (Dr. Bowerbank's 'Spongrades' Vol. II).

Three volumes will be issued for the year 1866:

 The first volume of the works of the late Robert Brown, edited by J. J. Bennett, Esq., F.R.S.

 'Recent Memoirs on the Cetacea,' translated from the Danish and Swedish; edited by W. H. Flower, Esq., F.P.S.

3. Dr. Nitzsch on 'Pterylography,' translated from the German.

The Council are happy to find that the annual income arising from "the sale of books to the public at advanced prices" is steadily aug-

menting, and now exceeds one hundred pounds. Whilst the number of Members is increasing, and the sale of back volumes continues to yield an improving revenue, the Council find that they have annually an additional amount to expend in publications, and it is by no means improbable that they may soon be able to bring out more than three volumes in a year. Every Member has thus a direct interest in inducing others to join the Society, as by this means he obtains an increased number of volumes in return for his own subscription.

The Council are pleased to observe that many of the Members have adopted the suggestion made last year of giving their Bankers a permanent order for the payment of their Annual Subscriptions. To those who have not already done so it is suggested that they might for their own convenience make use of the following form:

REPORT

OF THE

COUNCIL OF THE RAY SOCIETY.

Read at the Twelfth Anniversary Meeting, held at Glasgow, Tuesday, Sept. 18th, 1855.

PROFESSOR FLEMING, D.D., F.R.S.E., in the Chair.

ACCORDING to usual custom, the Council beg to present their Twelfth Annual Report to the members of the Ray Society. Since the last Annual Meeting at Liverpool, all the Subscribers entitled to books for the years 1852, 1853, and 1854, have received the following works:

For 1852—Part VI of Alder and Hancock's 'Nudibranchiate Mollusca.'

For 1853—The second volume of Mr. Darwin's 'Monograph on the Cirripedia.'
For 1854—The fourth and last volume of Agassiz's 'Bibliographia Zoologie et Geologie.'

Two works are in a state of great forwardness, and will shortly be distributed to the Members. These are:

1. The seventh and last part of Alder and Hancock's 'Monograph of the Nudibranchiate Mollusca;' and

2. Professor Allman's 'Monograph of the British Freshwater Zoophytes.'

The last work will be published of the same size and form as the 'Nudibranchiate Mollusca,' and will be illustrated by ten coloured plates.

The Council have much pleasure in announcing that they have made arrangements with Professor T. H. Huxley, for the publication of his forthcoming work on 'Oceanic Hydrozoa,' which will be published in imperial 4to, and distributed at an early period to the Members.

The following works have already been announced for publication, and are now progress:

ACCHIVES

1. Professor Williamson 'On the British Foraminifera,' with plates of all the

species.
2. Dr. Carpenter 'On the General Structure and Organization of the Foraminifera,'

with plates.
3. Mr. Bowerbank 'Monograph of the British Spongiadæ,' with numerous

plates.

In announcing these very valuable zoological works, the Council would express a regret that they have not had offered them works of equal value devoted to the

illustration of the Vegetable Kingdom. They feel persuaded that subjects of research of equal interest exist amongst Plants, and they would urgently invite their botanical friends to follow the example of zoologists, and place in their hands the result of their researches for publication.

In reference to their financial condition, the Council have to regret that there still exists a large arrear of subscriptions, and that they are still in debt for expenses incurred in publishing the works of past years.

The number of Members at present subscribing to the Society is 720. Many of these have been added daring the past year, and the Council are happy to state that amongst those who have joined and subscribed from the beginning are his Royal Highness Prince Albert, the Right Hon. the Duke of Argyls, President of the British Association, and the Earl of Ducie. Members can be still supplied with works from the commencement, and the Council would urge on all those who are anxious to promote science, and the scientific pre-eminence of their country, to assist them in their labours. They feel proud to have been instrumental in giving such works to the world as those of Alder and Hancock, Darwin, Edward Forbes, and Baird, but they believe equally valuable works may yet be produced, provided the facilities for publication afforded by the Ray Society are held out to the naturalists of Great Britán. Although each Member obtains an ample return for the money subscribed, the Council would solicit assistance in their work on much higher grounds, namely.

the honour of their country, and the advancement of science.

The Council have never felt more the necessity for help than at this present moment, as on this occasion they have to lament the death of two of their carliest and most active colleagues. The late Dr. Johnston was the founder of this Society, and had it not been for his energy and activity in projecting and organizing its first efforts, it would never have accomplished so many of the objects which it was founded to promote. Although thing at a distance from London, the seal of the meetings of Council, to the last he took an active interest in all the publications and proceedings of the Society, and acted in the capacity of one of its Secretaries.

The late Professor Edward Forbes, whose premature decease is yet too fresh in the memory of all who cultivate science to permit of more than this passing allusion, took great interest in the proceedings of the Society, and was a constant attendant at the Council, and a contributor of one of its most valuable publications.

In filling up the list of their Members, the Council propose to add the names of Dr. Allman, Professor of Natural History in the University of Edinburgh, and Dr. Joseph Hooker, of Kew.

The Council elected Mr. Bowerbank as treasurer, and Dr. Johnston and Dr. Lankester as Secretaries for the past year.
