I have made a careful
comparison of your photo-
graphs with the specimen
of Caryophyllia acuta
described & figured by
Prof. Duncan. So far as

I am able to judge there is no reason for
distinguishing your specimens & any other
species than this. In fact, I have often
seen wider differences between specimens
sent to the King to the same species & found
the locality of our specimen is not definitely
marked, but it was either from 39° 29' N, 9° 35' W, or
36° 29' N, 20° 16' W, 30 N from.
